Dear Marjorie,

I have the impression that some time ago you were rather worried about the boundaries of permissible activity vis-a-vis getting congressional sympathy for more work on Huntington's Disease. I do not know whether this is still a live problem for you, but I just wanted to pass on to you that I have met the director of a foundation who is very much concerned about helping to prevent public interest groups from being intimidated by the IRS and who has looked very deeply into the legal aspects of this problem. I suspect that if you have any special situations along these lines he would be glad to take extra effort. I also think it would do no harm at all on other grounds for you to make some contact with him and initially perhaps on this issue.
