

Dear Dr. Lederberg,


I thank you for your letter of february 23 offering me the opportunity and the privilege to continue my research at Rockefeller University on a more stable basis by changing my present status of 'visiting professor' to that of 'adjunct professor'.

While I fully agree with the basis of the appointment you propose, I have still to make the contingent basic decision to change my residence in Geneva to a permanent residence in New York before I can express my formal acceptance. I am on my way to Geneva to review all aspects. In the meantime, please bear with me while I make the decision which I will communicate to you.

Incidentally, in Geneva I will attend a meeting of the WHO trypanosomiasis committee.

Please find enclosed new data indicating that the choroid plexus has indeed a special and rather general propensity to sequester metals, possibly as halides.
