We have been working here for some time now on some problems in bacterial inheritance, and are now about to focus our attention on the Salmonella group. For such investigations in Escherichia coli, specific phages proved to be very useful tools. However, we are very badly in need of advice concerning bacterial viruses active on Salmonella organisms.
