Dear Josh:

Last winter I discussed with you the American Agenda Report to President Bush. While much has changed in the world, there is no question that the Report has had a significant impact on the conduct of policy, not least because so many of the authors accepted senior positions in the Bush Administration.

As I am sure you are aware, Presidents Ford and Carter have continued their efforts to assist President Bush in a wide range of areas. Thus, a group of us joined the Presidents, Secretary Baker and the heads of a number of Latin American countries at the Carter Center last spring to discuss ways to achieve peace and progress in the Hemisphere. One of the short-term results of that meeting was the astonishing election in Nicaragua in which President Carter played such an important mediating role.

Similarly, a few weeks ago, a group of us met with President Carter in Atlanta to discuss his planned visit to the Middle East. Upon his return, he met with President Bush at the White House and briefed us in person here in Washington and through the enclosed summary of his various conversations. Knowing of your interest in these vital areas of national policy, I thought you might enjoy reading this summary.

I trust this letter finds you in good health and prospering. Please accept once again my thanks for your encouragement and support.
