On page S 17420 of the enclosed CONGRESSIONAL RECORD for December 20, 1969, you will find a reprint of an article by Mr. Joshua Lederberg, entitled "Air Pollution Ingredients Are Suspect for Mutation," which appeared in the October 18, 1969, edition of the WASHINGTON POST.
