I have been quite worried about it, because I was afraid that he might develop a mastoiditis. Although his ear is draining profusely, he is still having considerable fever, and I cannot help but feel that there might be some extension back into the mastoid process. I hope that nothing does develop, but that he clears up without any trouble.
